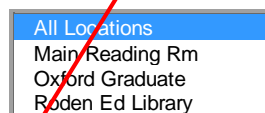

NOTE: Ignore the MRR (Main Reading Room prefix). Scroll until you find the course title you need in the Reserves list and click to reveal that course's books.

EXAMPLE: COM 912 Advanced Communication: Leadership, Culture, & Change. Notice that this course has 90 books on its course reserve shelf in the OGS physical library. This may have overlaps but is different than the Course Bibliography in the Syllabus because books are added to the shelf as new acquisitions are added. This is a list of on-campus physical, not digital, books. If you review this list the titles will give you a sense of the range of subjects addressed by the course. If you see a title of interest, look it up and find it when on campus. From off campus you can look it up on Amazon.com, on Google Books, or at a library accessible to you.

Research and Developmental Reading Assignment Tips: Reading book lists teaches you more than a feel for the scope of the subject covered in the book list. It will give you a sense of the subject as you look for other sources consistent with the list. The same is true for the Course Bibliography in the Syllabus. Book lists represent the judgement of people familiar with a domain of literature. Graduate level research is about learning to recognize, find, and digest the best information on your desired subjects. As you continue to grow in familiarity with subjects and move towards mastery in your area of expertise, you will get better and faster at finding the best information on what you want to know as a scholar and life-long learner.
